The meeting of the Board of Supervisors was called to order at 9:06 am by Chairman Kent Grabill. The City of Kimballton joined the Supervisor meeting to make introductions and give current updates. Kimballton was represented by the City Clerk and Mayor. Javitma discussed their current dog ordinance and inquired about what the County is currently implementing to view as an example. They had no major concerns but had a couple of new water leaks.

Motion- Mosinski Second- Hansen to approve the meeting minutes of 6-16-26. Vote-all in favor. Chairman Grabill gave a current Veteran's Affairs update. There is an advertisement in the newspaper for the Director Position. Grabill spoke with Guthrie County Veteran's Affairs Director regarding a potential 28E agreement to have her help fill in during the vacancy and implementation of a new Director. Supervisors reviewed claims for payment. The Public Hearing for Budget Amendment #3 was opened at 10:12 am.

Engineer Rydl gave Secondary Roads maintenance and construction updates. Motion- Mosinski Second- Hansen to approve pay estimate #2 for the Mockingbird Ave project in the amount of \$224,121.58. Vote-all in favor. Interviews are being scheduled for the Roadside Assistant position this week. The Road Superintendent position being shared between two current employees was discussed. Rydl showed the current salaries and what he would potentially like to offer them as an increase to take on the shared position.

The Public Hearing for the first reading regarding an Ordinance Establishing a Reserve Deputy at 10:48 am. The Public Hearing for FY26 Budget Amendment #3 closed at 10:48 am. Sheriff Johnson discussed the first reading of the Reserve Deputy Ordinance. Sheriff discussed Ragbrai liquor licenses and setting a consistent end time for all of those that apply.

Snow Fox Discovery presented an informative slideshow regarding hydrogen possibilities within the County. The land leasing will be complete at the end of June 2026 with a successful and adequate number of acres signed to moved forward with the next step. Within the next few months, seismic data will be used to find a target

drilling location to potentially test drill in 2027. Environmental baseline testing, groundwater/tile protection and site remediation and reseeding after construction will be completed. There will be potential for future job openings for local individuals as the project progresses.

The Public Hearing for the first reading of the Ordinance Establishing a Deputy Reserve Program was closed at 11:22 am. There were no comments from the public. The second reading will be held next week.

Attorney Swensen discussed the current County Farm lease. The bid was approved last December, the payments are up to date, but the new lease has not been prepared/signed. Swensen will prepare the lease with some minor updates.

Motion- Hansen Second Mosinski to approve claims as submitted by various departments to be paid in the amount of \$348,758.66 and published in a separate publication at the end of the month. Vote-all in favor.
